# BOE STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES REPORT

Among the items that the BOE Student Representatives discussed this evening were; a fundraiser for Ms. Raz who is a BHS teacher that was recently diagnosed with cancer, upcoming band, orchestra and choir concerts, the recent PJ Day fundraiser (\$1 donation for children with cancer), the start of winter sports (ice hockey, basketball, wresting and indoor track), mid-term assessments (begin after Christmas break) proceeded by the end of the quarter, due to the planned Main Street construction project graduation will be held on the BHS Athletic Complex, if approved this evening several new courses will be in the 2025/2026 Course of Studies, the new community service resources (branfordvolunteers.org) has been pushed out to the students (students need 40 hours community service as a graduation requirement) and the community service fair has been rescheduled to January.

# SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Among the items that Dr. Tranberg discussed this evening were; the District has been awarded a 6.3 million dollar federal grant through the U.S. Department of Environmental Protection Agency for the Clean Heavy Duty Vehicles Program (grants were awarded in 27 states, Branford was the only district in Connecticut to be awarded), the grant will help fund 21 zero emissions electric buses and we are looking at quarter two for delivery, the district will be partnering with the Martin Luther King, Jr. Heritage Foundation on their annual MLK Breakfast (January 20), this year's guest speaker at the MLK event is Jeffrey C. Stewart (Pulitzer Prize winner), students from BHS Class Act Culinary Program will be catering and BHS Music Makers will be performing, guest sign-in procedures will be updated starting in January, inclement weather notifications can be changed through Infinite Campus, the process that we go through to make weather closing determinations, WIS turf fields have been laid (feel free to take a look, but it is still a construction zone please do not enter) and Central Office's recent professional development using Will Guidara's book *Unreasonable Hospitality*. Dr. Tranberg ended his report by wishing everyone a happy and safe holiday season.

## PRESENTATION

## A. School Resource Officer

Dr. Tranberg began his presentation this evening by recapping the Districts Mission and Global Learning Competencies (especially Citizenship and Civic Responsibilities), Strategic Coherence Plan (including a specific goal to engage more of our stakeholders) and Deep Learning (the four pillars - feedback, content, context and community). Among the items Dr. Tranberg discussed this evening were; a community partnership between the Branford BOE and the Branford Police Department, Maslow's Hierarchy (connection to something greater than self, self-actualization, esteem, belonging, safety and physiology), SRO Program Pillars -
