03 Community Updates

In his report this evening, Superintendent Tranberg discussed the dates for upcoming flu clinics being held in the community.

04 Cell Phone Usage

In continuation to last month's discussion of cellphone usage and the group reading of the book, *The Anxious Generation*, Superintendent Tranberg and the Committee members discussed the following; the questions that Dr. Tranberg posed, Yondr pouches (what are we thinking, the cost and having a policy), the Superintendent's recent meeting with the Library Directors and what having community education

would look like, needing additional information before there is a sweeping change, what Dr. Tranberg has learned (Boards have approached in two different ways - what we are doing now educating ourselves and gathering information from the Community, deciding whether or not it warrants policy change and what other Boards without any community input have said, the finding that Boards that have spent the time getting community input have had a less bumpy ride getting there), more information regarding students interacting with each other, sharing experts from the Anxious Generation book, an anecdote regarding Yondr pouches (not having access during school), how to go about engaging the community in a discussion, getting community support, asking ourselves the question if this is a distraction distracting students from learning, looking at survey results, having trouble with the thought of taking a lot of time to police it, getting support from parents/guardians, a mental health crisis (associated with social media and having devices put away is critical), having them away in younger grades may work but may not at higher grades (hard to enforce), having policy address not only cell phones but other personal use items as part of it (Apple watches, Mac Books, etc.), presenting the circumstance and deciding it as a whole, coming up with something straight across the board, problems will not go away overnight, dealing with it as we go (anything that contributes to it – we should address), what fits and works would be justifiable to the community, controlling what happens during school hours, as Board we look at what enhancing education experience of kids, not solving the problem but working on part of the problem (a whole spectrum of things, here to make school the best it can be), a lot more to it then just the cell phone (having free play, finding common ground to grow, setting the example – having freedom from phones), next steps and conversations in the community, having a basic understanding of the actual science behind this, having focus groups further on in the year, work we have to do and providing a balance, having a more formal presentation next month, encouraging interactions that help children grow and teaching social skills.
