# Memo

During the September meeting of the Board of Education Communication Committee, we began a discussion regarding the role cell phones, technology and social media play in the lives of students and the potential impact on their education. Due to time constraints, the conversation focused on a brief summary of the text, *The Anxious Generation*, as well as BOE requests for additional information to inform future discussion.

A3: Yes, student handbooks acurately reflect practice in schools.


Several additional questions were addressed through a faculty and student survey distributed at BHS. Faculty responses represent 81 participants and student responses represent 302 responses.





I spend a great deal of time enforcing the school cell phone policy during the year. 81 responses




It is a problem getting students to put their phones away when class begins.  $\ensuremath{\text{80}}$  responses




Students are not interacting with the people around them when they are outside of class because of cell phones.




Students are not interacting with the people around them when they are outside of class because of cell phones.
