The RTM convened on Wednesday, June 12, 2024, at 8:01 p.m., at Branford Fire Headquarters, 45 North Main Street, to consider and act upon the following matters:

1. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance

Moderator Amore led the Body in the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Call of the Roll:

3. Approval of Minutes of May 14, 2024 Meeting

Motion to approve made by Rep. Laich, 2nd by Rep. Verderame. The minutes were approved unanimously in a voice vote.

4. Receipt of Communications, Reports of Committees, and Citizen Petitions

Moderator Amore read correspondence from:

- A. Gregg Jerolman, requesting the legality of the May 14th RTM meeting be reviewed by Town Counsel and the RTM Parliamentarian. Moderator Amore referred this matter to the Rules & Ordinances Committee.
- B. Rep. Hynes, expressed his concerns that the public was not informed that Rep. Hartwell presented some incorrect figures on May 14 to the RTM. Moderator Amore stated that the corrected amounts would be included in the minutes and will be appended to the May 14th minutes as necessary.

Moderator Amore requested an item concerning the Neighborhood Assistance Tax Act, (NAA,) be added to the RTM Agenda as Item 5. Motion to add made by Rep. Adelman, 2nd by Rep. Hartwell. The RTM voted unanimously to add the NAA item to the agenda.

5. To consider and review the Town of Branford's 2024 applications for submission to the State of Connecticut under the Neighborhood Assistance Tax Act. The 2024 NAA applications are:

Feed Branford Kids, \$10,000, Branford Land Trust, \$100,000, Connecticut Hospice, \$100,000, Connecticut Hospice, \$50,000, Branford Electric Railway, \$64,850, First Congregational Church, \$35,000. We Are One, \$24,000, Tail to Paw, \$75,000.

Rep. Adelman stated that the Administrative Services Committee reviewed the NAA applications. Rep. Adelman recused himself from voting on the We Are One application. The Committee approved all applications unanimously and he put the matter forward to the full RTM as a motion. A corrected motion was made by Rep. Adelman, seconded by Rep. McCormack, to hold two RTM votes on the NAA applications. The 1st RTM vote is on a group of 7 NAA applications: Feed Branford Kids, Branford Land Trust, Connecticut Hospice, Connecticut Hospice, Branford Electric Railway, First Congregational Church, Tall to Paw. The 2nd RTM vote is only on the We Are One NAA application. This motion passed the RTM unanimously in a voice vote. For the 1st vote, the RTM voted unanimously to approve the group of 7 NAA applications. Rep. Adelman then recused himself and left the room. We Are One's Ashley Phan spoke. For the 2nd RTM vote, the RTM voted unanimously to approve the NAA We Are One application. Rep. Adelman returned to the room.

Moderator Amore read a proposed resolution to clarify Item 7: The RTM authorizes an increase in the cumulative ARPA fund appropriations from \$7,690,500 to \$7,710,500. This appropriation will provide a grant to the East Shore Health District to conduct a water study in the Short Beach section of Branford. A motion to add the resolution to Item 7 was made by. Rep. Hentschel, 2nd by Rep. Laich. Approved unanimously by the full RTM in a voice vote. Rep. Adelman stated that this item was heard by the Administrative Services Committee. The proposed transfer was approved unanimously. He put the matter in the form of a motion to the full RTM. Several Representatives spoke in support of the transfer. The RTM approved the item unanimously by voice vote.

8. To consider and, if appropriate, approve a transfer request from the Inland Wetlands Agency for the following transfer for FY 2024:

Rep. Hentschel stated the Rules and Ordinances Committee did not hear this matter. Rep. McCormack moved, 2nd by Rep. Hentschel, to waive RTM Rule 4.4.1. The motion was approved unanimously in a voice vote by the full RTM. The transfer is required for legal notices cost. Rep. Hentschel moved, 2nd by Rep. Verderame, the motion was approved by the full RTM in a voice vote.

9. To consider and, if appropriate, create an ordinance to establish a harbor management commission, pursuant to CGS 22a-113k.

Rep. Hentschel stated the Rules and Ordinances Committee has established a subgroup to draft language for this Commission. The Committee voted unanimously to request a rereferral and he put that forward in the form of a motion. The full RTM voted unanimously in favor of the motion in a voice vote.

10. To consider, and if appropriate, create an ordinance which will encode reasonable restrictions on short-term rentals in Branford.

Rep. Hentschel reported the Rules and Ordinances Committee has established a subgroup to research this matter. The Committee voted unanimously to ask for a rereferral, and he put that forward to the RTM in the form of a motion. In a voice vote, the full RTM voted unanimously in favor.

11. To consider, and if appropriate, create an ordinance to change the position of Town Clerk from an elected position to an appointed one.

Rep. Hentschel stated the Rules and Ordinances Committee has established a subgroup to research this proposal. The Committee voted unanimously to ask the RTM for a rereferral. He put that forward to the RTM in the form of a motion. The full RTM voted unanimously to approve.

 - A. Rep. Ingraham questioned why Mr. Jerolman's request was sent to the Rules and Ordinances Committee instead of to the RTM Parliamentarian.
 - B. Gregg Jerolman raised concerns about lack of procedures at the May 14th RTM budget meeting.
