DECLARING WEEK OF JUNE 2, 2024 TO BE

GUN VIOLENCE AWARENESS WEEK

WHEREAS, 219 people were killed with firearms in Connecticut during 2023, the third highest number of gun deaths in more than a decade; and

WHEREAS, firearms are the second-leading cause of suicide in Connecticut and account for half of all gun deaths in our state; and

WHEREAS, interpersonal gun violence in urban centers accounts for a majority of gun homicides in Connecticut and disproportionately harms communities of color; and

WHEREAS, firearms are now the leading cause of death of children and teens in the U.S., surpassing motor vehicle accidents; and

WHEREAS, health experts including the American Public Health Association, the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Pediatrics have declared gun violence a public health crisis; and

WHEREAS, exposure to gun violence can change a child's brain development and lead to short and long term consequences, including decreased academic performance, chronic health problems, substance abuse and unstable employment; and

WHEREAS, pervasive crisis response drills needed to prepare students in the case of a school shooting create emotional harm; and

WHEREAS, more than 80 percent of child firearm suicides use a gun belonging to a family member and three-quarters of school shooters obtain the gun they used from their home or the home of a relative; and

WHEREAS, abused women are five times more likely to be killed if the partner owns a firearm and nearly 1 million women have reported being shot at by an abuser; and

WHEREAS, six out of ten firearms recovered at crime scenes in Connecticut in 2022 came from out of state, all from states with weaker gun regulations than ours; and

WHEREAS, nationally in 2021 police recovered more than 19,000 untraceable ghost guns that are preferred by criminals, a tenfold increase from 2016; and

WHEREAS, this June 2 would have been the 27th birthday of Hadiya Pendleton, a teen who was shot and killed as an innocent bystander in a park in Chicago, following which Hadiya's friends chose to **Wear Orange** on her birthday because hunters wear the color orange to protect themselves; and

WHEREAS, by joining together we can call attention to this public health crisis and signal our commitment to reducing gun violence in all its forms.

NOW THEREFORE WE, The Board of Selectmen, do hereby declare the week of June 2, 2024* Gun Violence Awareness Week in the Town of Branford.

* CT Against Gun Violence observes Gun Violence Awareness Day on June 2, Hadiya Pendleton's birthday while Everytown for Gun Safety now recognizes the first Friday in June and following weekend as Wear Orange (June 7-9 in 2024). Proclamations can recognize either June 2 or 7, 2024.
